- Assist in developing a coaching philosophy for the club
- Developing a masters program, Recreation and Competitive
- Continuing the summer competitive youth program after CSSRA
- Working with Board of Directors to continue growing the profile of the club
- Introduce a fall racing program for Juniors, and Recreation masters
- Assist the club is growing the membership and retaining current members

The BRC is located in one of the fastest growing communities in Ontario. Our community still remains relatively untapped. We have had several years of strong acquisitions for new equipment and house it all in a secure location with change/restrooms, and training room on site. Our progressive board has made staffing and program development a highlight for the past 4 years. Our base of athletes is strong and growing, with a lot of potential for competitive programming.

Employee assets

This coach position will be complimented with Learn to Row instructors, as well as a club manager/safety boat driver. There are also several coaching resources within the club who are committed to the success of the club and athletes.

The Barrie Rowing Club is located in Simcoe County, at the gateway to Ontario's tourism country, in one of the region's most dynamic growth communities. Our club is nestled on beautiful Kempenfelt Bay, in the heart of downtown Barrie. We have a membership of 120

rowers, 20 kilometres of rowable water, and a large complement of club and privately owned boats.

Our racing fleet consists of 3 eights, 8 fours, 2 quads, 6 doubles/pairs, 2 singles plus about 10 privately owned singles. We also have a Wintech double and single dedicated to the adaptive program. In addition to the racing fleet, we have 3 Hudson T-11s, 1 T-7, 1 T-6 and an elderly German triple scull to support our touring and recreational programs. We have 6 deep hull aluminum motorboats for safety and coaching. The club also owns two boat trailers, a large unit, and a light one carrying 4 fours which can be towed by a van or light truck. Our main dock is parallel to the shore, 100' (30 meter) long, made of Jetfloat cubes, and accessed via a 12' (3.6 meter) wide ramp. We are able to launch an eight and two fours and a double simultaneously.

In the early spring, a total of 85 student athletes, from our high school program of 4 schools, attend a number of major regional events including:

- Mothersday head race Peterborough
- Welland Invite
- Doug and Sam Wells WOSSA Championship, London
- CSSRA Championships, St. Catharines
- North Central Ontario Highschool Rowing Champs (Barrie)

In the past up to 16 rowers of all ages, from our summer competitive program, attend events such as:

- CORA regattas and Champs
- Row Ontario Champs
- Royal Canadian Henley Regatta, St. Catharines

We also have a growing adaptive program which has a new dock specially designed to make launching easier for wheelchair athletes. We are anticipating new interest in this program as a direct result.
